Scripture Lesson: Luke 1:26-38, The Birth of Jesus Foretold (ESV)

²⁶ In the sixth month the angel Gabriel was sent from God to a city of Galilee named Nazareth, ²⁷ to a virgin betrothed to a man whose name was Joseph, of the house of David. And the virgin's name was Mary. ²⁸ And he came to her and said, "Greetings, O favored one, the Lord is with you!" ²⁹ But she was greatly troubled at the saying, and tried to discern what sort of greeting this might be. ³⁰ And the angel said to her, "Do not be afraid, Mary, for you have found favor with God. ³¹ And behold, you will conceive in your womb and bear a son, and you shall call his name Jesus. ³² He will be great and will be called the Son of the Most High. In response to the significant rise in premature births in the past three decades, the March of Dimes, a national

CHURCH VOLUNTEER OPPERTUNITIES FOR 2026

Nominations for church offices are welcome at any time.

According to the Book of Discipline, Individuals who undertake particular ministries including Ad Council and Lay Leadership Roles, should be persons of strong faith, dedicated to discipleship, and lover of Jesus Christ as Savior and Lord. Their manner of life should be a demonstration of the Christian gospel in the church and in the world. They should be persons who actively demonstrate or model the making of Disciples for the Transformation of the World.

All church officers must be active members for at least one year prior to election, which occurs in November with all terms beginning in January. Terms of office are three years for Ad Council and Lay Leadership Roles. This year we invite our new members to submit names for consideration if you have just joined our Urbana First.


