SCRIPTURE LESSON: Acts 17:16-28

Paul in Athens

¹⁶Now while Paul was waiting for them at Athens, his spirit was provoked within him as he saw that the city was full of idols. ¹⁷So he reasoned in the synagogue with the Jews and the devout persons, and in the marketplace every day with those who happened to be there. ¹⁸Some of the Epicurean and Stoic philosophers also conversed with him. And some said, "What does this babbler wish to say?" Others said, "He seems to be a preacher of foreign divinities"—because he was preaching Jesus and the resurrection. ¹⁹And they took him and brought him to the Areopagus, saying, "May we know what this new teaching is that you are presenting? ²⁰ For you bring some strange things to our ears. We wish to know therefore what these things mean." ²¹ Now all the Athenians and the foreigners who lived there would spend their time in nothing except telling or hearing something new.

Paul Addresses the Areopagus

²² So Paul, standing in the midst of the Areopagus, said: "Men of Athens, I perceive that in every way you are very religious. ²³ For as I passed along and observed the objects of your worship, I found also an altar with this inscription: 'To the unknown god.' What therefore you worship as unknown, this I proclaim to you. ²⁴ The God who made the world and everything in it, being Lord of heaven and earth, does not live in temples made by man, ²⁵ nor is he served by human hands, as though he needed anything, since he himself gives to all mankind life and breath and everything. ²⁶And he made from one man every nation of mankind to live on all the face of the earth, having determined allotted periods and the boundaries of their dwelling place, ²⁷ that they should seek God, and perhaps feel their way toward him and find him. Yet he is actually not far from each one of us, ²⁸ for

"In him we live and move and have our being'; as even some of your own poets have said, "For we are indeed his offspring.'

CHILDREN'S CORNER: Acts of Kindness

²⁴ He is the God who made the whole world and everything in it. He is the Lord of the land and the sky. He does not live in temples that men build! ²⁵ This God is the One who gives life, breath, and everything else to people. He does not need any help from them. He has everything he needs. ²⁶ God began by making one man. From him came all the different people who live everywhere in the world. He decided exactly when and

where they must live. ²⁷ God wanted them to look for him and perhaps search all around for him and find him. But he is not far from any of us: ²⁸ 'By his power we live and move and exist.' Some of your own poets have said: 'For we are his children.' Acts 17:24-28, ICB

Have you ever planted something from a seed? Maybe it was some flowers or vegetables! How long did it take until you started to see the plant growing? A day? A week? A month? If you looked at where you planted the seed on the first day, it would be hard to tell that a plant would grow there! Sharing God's love with people can be like planting a seed. You don't always know what sharing love with someone will grow into and sometimes you don't get to see it right away, but with God's care, it could grow into something beautiful.

Remember it's not just what you say, but how you say it. When we share our love for God with other people, it's important to remember to be patient and kind. You may have been going to church for a while, but maybe your friends in class have never been, so it's important to be kind and share your love for God in a way that includes them and doesn't make them feel bad for not knowing what you know about Jesus. This week let's be like Paul and show kindness with not just words, but our actions as well.

Let's Pray! Dear God, sometimes we get so excited to talk about what we love and to talk about you! Help us to always remember to be patient, kind, and listen to others. Amen.
